## Notes prior to the operation in the Cinic for MIC

# Preoperative fasting:

Last meal 6 hours prior to the operation Last drink 2 hours prior to the operation; please do not smoke or have sweets or chewing gum after this point of time.

#### Medicine:

Please take your medicine in the morning of the operation day as usual with a bit of water.

ASS/Aspirin has to be discontinued at least 10 days prior to the operation, except for therapy after vascular surgery (e.g. coronary bypass; stenting etc). In this case ASS should be continued.

## Please note: ASS may be contained in other analgetic drugs as well.

If pain medication is necessary, you can take Paracetamol (acetaminophen), Ibuprofen or Metamizol. Please mind this when you are on the waiting list.

### On the ward:

Jewellery, watches and piercings have to be removed to avoid injuries.

Please remove dental plates.

Please remove nail polish.

Please tie your hair.

Hearing aids can be left in place.

Please bring a list of your medication (name of drugs, dosage, schedule of intake)

If available, information about:

Anaesthesiological complications

Blood group

Allergies
